The footage of Zuckerberg was an example of a deepfake, a video that uses AI to make it appear as if someone is saying or doing something they never did in real life. While we are used to being fooled by the computer-generated images of big Hollywood movies, almost anybody can use deepfake technology to trick us. So far, most deepfakes have been silly jokes, but they are capable of far more. Many experts think this technology is very dangerous. A video of a president warning about an imminent attack could cause a panic. A person’s life could be ruined by a convincing video of them committing a crime. An election could be influenced by last-minute fake footage of a candidate saying something inappropriate. Some have warned that deepfakes could signal the beginning of a “post-truth” era in which we shouldn’t trust anything we don’t see or hear in person. The other, the “discriminator,” tries to determine if the video is fake or not. Over time, the generator and the discriminator become better and better at their jobs, and eventually, the imitation becomes so realistic that it’s hard for even a human to tell it isn’t genuine. Deepfakes need a lot of data to get started, especially photos and videos of a person’s face from numerous angles. That’s why most of the videos produced have been of people who are often in the public eye, like politicians and celebrities. It’s also difficult to use AI to imitate a person’s voice, so the videos usually rely on actors to deliver the lines. But cutting-edge technology may not even be necessary to make videos that can fool people. The main character is a loyal pet mongoose who saves his family from death at the hands of a pair of cobras. For most people, this story is their first and only exposure to these slender-bodied, bushy-tailed, and highly curious animals, so there is much that people don’t understand about them. For instance, many believe a mongoose’s superpower is being immune to snake venom. After all, in the Kipling story, the mongoose survives a visit to a cobra’s den. The reality is that while mongooses can tolerate quite a lot of snake venom, they will die if they sustain enough bites. Luckily, mongooses have a fighting strategy that puts them mostly out of the reach of a snake’s strike. A mongoose will circle around the snake, biting its tail and causing it to repeatedly strike in defense. Eventually the snake wearies, a situation that gives the mongoose a chance to deliver a final fatal6 blow to the back of the snake’s head. In this way, mongooses win around 80 percent of their fights with snakes—even against the most dangerous kinds. The mongoose’s reputation as a capable killer has made it a popular companion animal for centuries since they keep their owners safe and their owners’ property pest-free. They were held in great regard by ancient Egyptians for daring to eat the eggs of crocodiles. Like the Egyptians, other groups throughout history have seen mongooses as lucky or even sacred. Deciding to capitalize on the mongoose’s skills, farmers in Hawaii and the West Indies imported the animal during the 1890s to help eliminate rats from their sugarcane fields. There were two major problems with this plan: unlike rats, mongooses are active during the day, and they will generally eat whatever prey is easiest to find and kill. On these islands, the easiest sources of prey were the native bird and reptile populations. This resulted in the mongooses’ harming sea turtles and causing ground-nesting birds in Jamaica to go extinct. Due to the

damage they can bring about, keeping mongooses is now illegal in the United States and several other countries. Though they threaten animals in places where they’ve been introduced, mongooses are themselves threatened in their native habitats because of farming and land development. It seems even such fierce killers cannot withstand the force that is humankind.

They settled on the name Ratel, which means honey badger in Afrikaans. But how could a creature no bigger than a dog be the fiercest animal in a land full of lions, leopards, and rhinos? If you had ever seen a honey badger fight, however, you would understand their decision. Honey badgers are known across Africa and parts of Asia as animals that no one wants to mess with. Their powerful jaws, sharp claws, and courageous spirit have earned them the distinction of “world’s most fearless animal” from Guinness World Records. Honey badgers are fearless because they have to be. Their fast metabolisms force them to hunt constantly to keep their energy levels up, so they eat almost anything regardless of the danger. They will put up with hundreds of bee stings, for example, because they love honey and bee larvae. Not only that, but they regularly make a meal of poisonous snakes—including ones with venom strong enough to melt human skin. Especially daring honey badgers have even been known to fight off lions to steal their kill.

A honey badger’s skin is so thick that it can resist knives, spears, and arrows. The only safe place to grab a honey badger is at the back of its neck, but you probably wouldn’t want to get that close. It’s not a question many of us have ever thought to ask, but Mother Nature has given us the answer anyway—a pangolin! These fascinating little creatures are covered from head to tail in tough scales and can produce a foul smell that makes predators flee in disgust. Pangolins also have extremely long tongues, which they use to lick up over 200,000 insects—mostly ants and termites—per day. This makes them particularly welcome in farming communities, where they are known as free, highly efficient pest controllers. Found in Asia and Africa, pangolins get their name from the Malay word penggulung, which means “roller.” When attacked, a pangolin will roll up into a tight little ball, covering its head with its front legs and tail. Since its hard scales act as a suit of armor, even big cats like lions have trouble getting past the pangolin’s defenses. Though their scales may make them look like reptiles, pangolins are, in fact, mammals. You’d be forgiven for mistaking them for a relative of the dinosaurs, though, since they are thought to have been around for over 80 million years.

penggulung????? 2/21 Despite their talent for protecting themselves, pangolins are in serious danger of becoming extinct. While their scales may protect them from lions and other predators, they cannot keep pangolins safe from humans, who simply pick them up off the ground as soon as they roll into a defensive ball. Not having teeth doesn’t help much either, nor does their gentle, nonaggressive nature. As a result, roughly 100,000 pangolins are illegally caught each year and shipped to China and Vietnam, where their scales are said to cure a whole range of health conditions. After being caught and killed, the poor creatures are disguised as fish or snakes and smuggled into traditional medicine shops. From there, pangolin scales are sold to willing customers at huge prices. In fact, it’s been estimated that the illegal trade in pangolins is worth about \$19 billion a year. Due to this unlawful hunting, the number of pangolins still left in the wild has dropped dramatically. Though no one is sure precisely how many are left, far fewer sightings of wild pangolins, along with the surge in illegal trade, suggest that some species are very close to extinction. Unless drastic action is taken, the pangolin’s 80-million-year existence might soon come to a premature end.
